Preface

The goal of Foundation *Denk en Herdenk* (translation: "Think and Remember") is to create awareness amongst the Dutch youth about one of the most horrific periods of history, the Holocaust. This awareness is created through education and organization of the March of the Living trip to specific places in Poland that were the setting of persecution and destruction of Jewish life and thought in the run-up to and during the Second World War.

The March of the Living gives Dutch youth and students the chance to take a closer look at these places. A professional guide accompanies the group. Visiting concentration camps, former Jewish ghettos and cemeteries provides participants with the unique chance to gain more knowledge and a better understanding of the history in the actual place of happening. The nineth March of the Living trip from the Netherlands to Poland took place in 2019. Unfortunately, there was not a March of the Living delegation from the Netherlands during the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic in 2022. However, March of the Living (MOTL) UK did manage to form a delegation after the annulment of the COVID-19 restrictions on a short notice. Two Dutch participants were allowed to participate within MOTL UK. We, as Foundation *Denk en Herdenk*, partly subsidized their participation costs and the flight tickets.

Next to organizing the March of the Living, the foundation promotes remembrance activities such as the yearly National Remembrance Day on May 4th, The Holocaust Memorial Day/National Auschwitz Memorial Day and remembrance ceremonies which take place at various Dutch universities and colleges throughout the Netherlands.

I. Activities and Organization

1. Activities

After the annulment of the COVID-19 restrictions, the International March of the Living eventually decided to continue its annual program. Unfortunately, Foundation *Denk en Herdenk* did not have the opportunity to organize a trip on such a short notice. However, March of the Living UK did manage to form a delegation after the annulment of the COVID-19 restrictions. Two Dutch participants were allowed to participate. We, as Foundation *Denk en Herdenk*, partly subsidized their participation costs and the flight tickets.

The board held several (online) meetings in 2022.

In the Netherlands, Foundation *Denk en Herdenk* is the only entity that organizes participation in the March of the Living.

1.1 March of the Living

March of the Living (MOTL) is an international and educational program which exists since 1988 and is accessible for youth and students from all over the world. The central day of this annual program is Yom HaShoah, Remembrance Day of the Shoah. On this day, the March of the Living takes place, symbolizing the continuation of life in contrast to the death marches, the forcible movement of the prisoners of the concentration camp Auschwitz after its evacuation.

Nowadays, more than 10,000 people from all over the world participate with the March as a symbol of survival and more than that, to make a statement that the Shoah must never happen again. The March is preceded by visits to several places in Poland which were the setting for the horrors of the persecution of the Jews. The participants are accompanied by an experienced guide and places visited are concentration camps, former ghettos, old Jewish neighborhoods, and cemeteries.

The mission of the March of the Living is to create awareness amongst future generations about the Shoah, and the six million Jews which have been murdered during this period. In the Netherlands, Foundation *Denk en Herdenk* is the only entity that organizes participation in the March of the Living.

As in previous years, the focus for the March of the Living will be young people between the ages of 18 and 30. We have seen that there is a real need for a trip for these ages. Young adults are exploring themselves and a trip like this made many of them realize that in order to create a better future for the Jews in the Netherlands, you need to learn from the past. A trip like the March of the living helps to create awareness and is still, after so many years, a hot topic in the youth in the Netherlands especially with the rise of Anti-Semitism around the world

In the coming years, the foundation will continue to strive for a larger engagement with its target audience. In 2023, additional attention will be given to promotion using (social) media. All this to enlarge the audience and create a March of the Living trip for as many people as people in its target audience.
